Using a fleet of Zodiacs, kayaks, and paddleboards, you'll explore crystalline waters and land on isolated cayes. The snorkeling is immensely satisfying, and your ship is equipped with all the gear you need. And for those who want to and are certified to scuba dive, excursions can be arranged to fit seamlessly with our itinerary.

Cruise coastal rivers in Zodiacs, and explore the lush jungle on foot, tackling trails with an expert naturalist who will point out colorful birds, tree frogs, monkeys, and other wildlife. At Mayflower-Bocawina National Park, learn about ongoing research into the behaviors of Belize's jaguars from scientists and researchers.

Make the most of your trip with a land extension venturing into the rainforest to the ancient ruins of Tikal, once the hub of Maya civilization. Walk among incredibly well-preserved stone temples, palaces, and ceremonial structures, delving deep into its culture and mystery. And discover seldom-visited Yaxhá, the third largest ruins of the Maya world.

Choose between two exciting itineraries: a 6-day voyage to Belize or a 9-day sea and land expedition combining Belize with Tikal. I hope you will opt to join us. Scott Solomon teaches ecology, evolutionary biology, and scientific communication in the Department of Biosciences and the Glasscock School of Continuing Studies at Rice University. He received a Ph.D. in Ecology, Evolution, and Behavior from the University of Texas at Austin where his research examined the evolutionary origins of biodiversity among leafcutter ants in the Amazon Basin. He has also worked as a visiting researcher with the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. and São Paulo State University in Rio Claro, Brazil. He is the author of Future Humans: Inside the Science of Our Continuing Evolution, published by Yale University Press in 2016, and a digital course called What Darwin Didn't Know: The Modern Science of Evolution available through Great Courses










BELIZE: DIVE INTO A WEALTH OF BIODIVERSITY



The Belize Barrier Reef, the largest reef system in the Northern Hemisphere, reveals hundreds of species of fish, marvelous sea turtles, graceful rays, gentle manatees, and over 90 varieties of coral. As only a small percentage of the reef has been

studied, researchers believe hundreds, even thousands, more species could be discovered in this protected zone. Much of Belize remains genuine wilderness, with large expanses of dense tropical forest, miles of wild rivers, and abundant bird life. Protecting 7,000 acres with three waterfalls, miles of hiking trails along creeks cutting through the tropical forest, Mayflower-Bocawina National Park is a gem in Belize's corridor of protected areas. Hike a nature trail with naturalists, photograph colorful tropical plants, search for exotic birds, and look out for the tracks of deer, tapirs, and wild cats. And learn of the extensive research on Central America's apex predator, the jaguar.

A NATURAL SUCCESS STORY



In 1996, the Belize Barrier Reef was designated a UNESCO World Heritage site. In 2009, it was added to the List of World Heritage Sites in Danger due to the detection of coral bleaching, mangrove cutting, and excessive development. But in 2019, the Belize Barrier Reef was removed from this list as UNESCO determined it no longer faced threats from development. In recent years,

the Belize government placed a moratorium on oil exploration around the reef and added protections for coastal mangrove forests. Our expeditions put you at the heart of it—to experience the reef in all its natural splendor.

Make the most of your time and explore the impressive ruins of the region, once the hub of classic Maya civilization. Spend a full day at Tikal, among extensive, well-preserved stone temples, palaces, ceremonial platforms, terraces, and roads cloaked in lush, wildlife-harboring vegetation.

Then discover seldom-visited Yaxhá, the third largest ruins of the Maya world, beautifully sited overlooking Yaxhá Lake.

Hike into the Maya Biosphere Reserve amid giant ceiba trees—the sacred tree of the Maya—and with the help of experienced naturalists, search for 400+ species of birds, howler and spider monkeys, tree frogs, and more.

Spend three nights at the beautiful Hotel Camino Real Tikal, your home base while you explore the Maya culture and ruins. The hotel is nestled in the rainforest, where you enjoy the many different species of birds while on an optional bird walk with your naturalist or relax on a sunset boat ride on Lake Petén Itzá.

WILD BELIZE ESCAPE: WILDLIFE, REEFS & RIVERS

6 DAYS/5 NIGHTS-NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC SEA LION

DAY 1: DEPART U.S./BELIZE CITY/EMBARK

Arrive in Belize City where we embark *National Geographic Sea Lion*. (D)

DAY 2: BELIZE BARRIER REEF

Awake anchored in the northern cayes of the Mesoamerican Reef System, second only to Australia's Great Barrier Reef in terms of biodiversity. Enjoy a full day to further explore this dynamic ecosystem. Take to the water by kayak or stand-up paddleboard, or don a mask and fins and dive into turquoise waters to encounter sea turtles, swirling schools of tropical fish, and harmless nurse sharks. For scuba divers, incredible dive opportunities abound (additional cost). (B,L,D)

DAY 3: MAYFLOWER-BOCAWINA NATIONAL PARK

Spend the morning discovering Mayflower-Bocawina National Park. Join the naturalists for a hike along one of the trails to photograph tropical plants, scan the treetops for winged wonders, and spot the tracks of tapirs and jungle cats. The national park is dotted with remote and strategically placed "camera traps," which frequently capture images of the legendary and mystical jaguar, so revered in Maya culture. At Bocawina, we learn about ongoing research into the behaviors of Belize's jaguars from scientists and researchers. Tonight, an internationally acclaimed drumming group, The Garifuna Collective, joins us on board for a festive music performance. (B,L,D)

DAY 4: MONKEY RIVER/BELIZE BARRIER REEF

At morning light we are at the mouth of Monkey River where we board Zodiacs to cruise inland through the Belizean jungle, in search of toucans, green iguanas, and myriad bird species. Few experiences rival hearing the first throaty roar of a mantled howler monkey echoing across the canopy. This afternoon, the Belize Barrier Reef calls us, home to idyllic sandy isles and vibrant corals, where we enjoy more opportunities to explore by snorkel, kayak, and stand-up paddleboard. For scuba divers, there are incredible dive opportunities (additional cost). (B,L,D)

DAY 5: BELIZE BARRIER REEF

Our second straight day on the reef brings us into the central cayes where we anchor close and go snorkeling, paddleboarding, diving, or kayaking inside the fringing reef. Coral patches dot the shallow lagoon, harboring parrotfish, butterflyfish, octopus, and other marine species. (B,L,D)



DAY 6: BELIZE CITY/DISEMBARK

Return to Belize City overnight and disembark after breakfast to transfer to the international airport for your flight home. Or continue on our land excursion to Tikal. (B)

BELIZE TO TIKAL: REEFS, RIVERS & RUINS OF THE MAYA WORLD

9 DAYS/8 NIGHTS-NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC SEA LION + LAND EXCURSION

DAYS 1-5: See above itinerary.

DAY 6: BELIZE CITY/EL REMATE, GUATEMALA

Disembark in Belize City and drive to El Remate, Guatemala, gateway to Tikal, one of the largest cities in the Classic Maya world. Enjoy lunch on the way before reaching the shores of picturesque Lake Petén Itzá and transferring to the Hotel Camino Real Tikal. Later, set out on a birding walk with our naturalists, or take a sunset boat cruise on the lake. (B,L,D)

DAY 7: TIKAL

Spend a full day exploring Tikal, where ancient pyramids tower more than 200 feet, and thousands of temples, shrines, and plazas are scattered beneath the rainforest canopy. Discover the site's archaeological treasures, including the Temple of the Great Jaguar and the North and South Acropolis. Encounter ancient Maya art and hieroglyphs, and examine carved stone inscriptions that illuminate the history and spiritual significance of Tikal. (B,L,D)

DAY 8: YAXHÁ

Explore Yaxhá, a former Maya ceremonial center situated on a ridge overlooking Yaxhá Lake. The world's third largest known Maya site, Yaxhá spreads across nine plazas and contains multiple pyramids, ball courts, and stelae. Examine its features with your local guides and, if you wish, climb a temple for panoramic views. Later, enjoy lunch at a traditional Guatemalan restaurant, followed by an evening at leisure. (B,L,D)

DAY 9: EL REMATE/BELIZE CITY/HOME

Drive this morning from El Remate to Belize City to connect with flights home. (B)



NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC SEA LION

CAPACITY: 31 outside cabins accommodating 62 guests.

OVERALL LENGTH: 152 feet.

REGISTRY: United States.

PUBLIC AREAS: The ship features a library; global market; lounge with full-service bar and facilities for films, slide shows, and presentations; observation deck; partially covered sun deck with chairs and tables; and LEXspa. An open Bridge provides guests an opportunity to meet the officers and captain and learn about navigation.

MEALS: Served in single seatings with unassigned tables for an informal atmosphere and easy mingling. Breakfasts are wide-selection buffets, and lunches are often served family style. Dinners are primarily served plated. Menu emphasizes local fare.

CABINS: All face outside with windows, private facilities, and climate controls.

EXPEDITION EQUIPMENT: Zodiacs, kayaks, paddleboards, snorkeling equipment, bow camera, hydrophone, splash-cam, underwater video camera, and video microscope.


SPECIAL FEATURES: Guest Wi-Fi access. A certified photo instructor, undersea specialist, and ship's doctor are on board.

WELLNESS: The vessel is staffed by a wellness specialist and features exercise equipment, LEXspa, and outdoor stretching area.

SELF-DISINFECTING SHIPS: Lindblad Expeditions became the first self-disinfecting fleet with the rollout of the ACT CleanCoat[™] system in 2019. This photocatalytic cleaning process activates when illuminated, continuously breaking down unwanted microbes such as bacteria, viruses, mold, and airborne allergens. The positive environmental impacts of this non-toxic, chemical-free system are many: less plastic in the supply chain and waste stream, and more than one million gallons of water saved annually. The system lowers our carbon footprint and creates a cleaner, healthier shipboard environment for guests and crew alike.

CATEGORY 1: Main Deck #300-305 — Conveniently positioned between the dining room and lounge, these cabins feature two lower single beds and a large view window.

CATEGORY 2: Bridge Deck #100-104; Upper Deck #200-212, 215 — These well-located cabins include two lower single beds and a window.

CATEGORY 3: Bridge Deck #105, 106; Upper Deck #214, 216, 217, 219 — These cabins feature a seating unit with table and two large view windows. Upper Deck cabins include two lower single beds which can convert to a double bed and a pull-out single bed for a third person; Bridge Deck cabins include two lower single beds only.

NOTE: Solo occupancy cabins are available in Categories 1 and 2 only. Third person rates are available in certain categories at one half the double occupancy rate.

SHARED ACCOMMODATIONS: Shares can be arranged at the double occupancy rate in Categories 1 and 2 only.
